GRADING:

ALL PROJECT UNITS **MUST BE COMPLETED**, PRINTED, AND PRESENTED IN ACETATE SLEEVES AT EACH OF THE EVALUATION DAYS LISTED.

If a unit is complete and graded on the due date, you may redo, correct problems and hand in for a better grade before the next unit due date.

No grades will be given for a unit which is incomplete on the date and time due. A late unit (*if it is handed in <u>before</u> the next unit due date*) will be graded down a full letter grade from what it would have gotten if on-time, ie: A to B, B+ to C+, etc. (if the unit is still incomplete it will be graded down more...see sample grade sheet) Units not handed in by the next unit due date will get a "zero".

FINAL EXAM:

There will be a two hour final exam during finals week (see finals schedule). This will consist of problems to be solved with the program, and written analysis of how you solved the design problems. Be sure to let your professor know if you have a final exam conflict with another course!

	1A: Create 4 Alphabet Book illustrations(any 4 letters you have not already done) Use the Large letter in a creative way and add text labels for all objects appearing in the illustration. (label: ALPHABET 1, 2, 3, 4, your name)
	1B: Create a complex photomontage with no text, using at least 4 layers based on a central theme or idea, ie: Christmas, Hannukah, Kwanza, Holiday Season, etc. Format size= 5"x7" in a photorealistic style. (label: CARD1 your name)
	1C: Use texture, and filters to manipulate images in 1B and create a new card design with a painterly style which looks hand done. (label: CARD2 your name)

	2A: Create a complex photorealistic Still-Life scene based on at least seven different photo source objects and a background. Format can be vertical or horizontal 6 x 8 (label: STILL-LIFE your name)
	2B: Modify the above project and add a text overlay, to create a magazine ad for some product or service. Ie: Smith's Pears & Fruit, Beth's Baskets, Lou's Fine China, etc(Label: AD DES your name)
	2C: Modify the Creative Still-Life in 3A into a textural fine art painting using filters, textures, handworking, etc. (label: FINE ART your name)

PRINT & HAND IN ALL OF UNIT 5 FOR GRADING, END OF LAST CLASS/ (include photo sources & present all work in plastic sleeves in the portfolio) (last chance for a grade on unit 4)

FINAL EXAM: (2 hours during exam week) You must take the exam and present your finished and complete portfolio. (Last chance for a grade on Unit 5)
